As ever at the EAF, the last three months has been a busy time with the EAF Print Championship and EAF Annual Exhibition.

The Print Championship saw a small increase in clubs entering and I would like to congratulate PICO who won after a very close finish, with Beyond Group in second place. This year we have an unprecedented six clubs representing the EAF at the

PAGB Print Championship in October as four of our clubs did so well at last year's event and so get an automatic entry this year. The results and award-winning prints are on show elsewhere in this Bulletin. My thanks to Hugh Spence our Championship Secretary and his organising team for putting on a great event.

The Annual Exhibition was held in the first two weeks of May and I'm pleased to say there was a modest increase in print entries this year. The Selectors had a hard job as the standard as ever was very high. Congratulations to John McDowall of Cambridge CC for achieving the Best Monochrome Print and Best Colour Print awards and to Sophia Spurgin of Bishop's Stortford CC for achieving the Best Projected Digital Image award. Again, more details are included later in this Bulletin. My thanks to Jim Bennett, our Exhibition Secretary and his team that help throughout the selection and exhibition process.

This will be our last Exhibition at Wingfield Barns. Visitors all agree it's a wonderful setting but so difficult to

get to. Next year we will be at a new venue in Bury St Edmunds.

On a slightly more worrying note, we are short of new judge applicants to replace those who are retiring. Many member clubs have regular competitions which are often the best attended meetings in any club programme. These rely on judges and there is a big advantage in choosing a judge from the EAF Judges' and Lecturer List. EAF judges have attended the Judges Workshop, have reached the required standard to become approved by the EAF.

To maintain a good choice of judges for our clubs we need new recruits. I'd be pleased if clubs would talk to their members who may be interested and emphasise the benefits of becoming a judge, or get them to have a chat the next time an EAF judge comes to the club.

It was a pleasure to attend the Ware &DPS 60th Anniversary lecture in April and listen to the inspirational landscape photographer, Charlie Waite.

Finally, with many clubs slowing down for the mid-year break, can I wish everyone a great summer and plenty of opportunities to make next season's award winning images.

OBITUARY

HOWARD (ANDY) HANSON MPAGB ARPS FIPF AWPF APAGB November 1934 - March 2024



Howard Hanson was born in November 1934, but from an early age was nicknamed Andy, which has remained ever since. He grew up in Wood Green, London and on the outbreak of war was evacuated with his sister Iris, to his grandparents in Nuneaton, returning to London after the conflict.

Andy served as a Cadet in the Air Training Corp where he played the bugle and, with his interest in drumming, taught the drummers in the

group. He worked for a time in Doc Hunts famous drum shop in Central London where many famous musicians came to have their drums made and where Andy made drums for himself. He then went on to study at Enfield Technical College leaving to become a draftsman, hence his many graphic photographs. He later joined the Post Office as a maintenance engineer, a Company he remained with for 34 years, until his retirement in 1997. His later years were spent as Manager of Cambridge Sorting Office where he was responsible for the maintenance, not only of Cambridge, but other Sorting Offices in Suffolk, Essex and Hertfordshire. Andy met Daphne in 1970 when she auditioned as a singer with the Trevor Blaber Set, a small dance band who played most weekends at local functions, such as weddings and community events in the area. Daphne got the job as their resident singer and with Andy as the drummer they enjoyed many years making music together. They went on to marry in 1971. Andy also played jazz from time to time with a trio in Cambridge, which was his preferred

At that time Andy was also developing and printing his own photographs and to encourage Daphne to share his hobby, they enlisted at the local Village College on a six-week photography course. Daphne had said, she was fed up sitting in the car waiting for him hours on end while he went

music genre.

to take photographs and thought if you can't beat them, join them. Once the course finished, the nine attendees founded the Burwell Photographic Club in 1973, which later became Bottisham & Burwell PC when the club moved to Bottisham. Andy and Daphne were two of the three remaining founder members. Andy was an active member of the club for over 50 years until his passing, gaining many awards and accolades over the years.

Andy was a talented photographer and a popular speaker who entertained camera club members for many years with his lectures. In 1985 Andy joined The EAF Executive Committee and took on the role of Judges' Officer, a post he held for eight years. In 1994 he entered for the DPAGB and on winning this award took on the role of the PAGB Awards Officer for the FAF until 2013. He later went on to achieve the coveted MPAGB in 2005, which was his greatest achievement. He was elected President of the EAF for the years 2006 and 2007.



In 1997, Andy and Daphne were both presented with the Award for Meritorious Service, by the then President of the PAGB, Terry Chapman. In addition, Andy gained Fellowship of the Irish Photographic Federation, Associate of the Royal Photographic Society and Associate of the Welsh Photographic Federation. He also regularly entered the London Salon Exhibition and was awarded two Gold Medals, one in 2019 for his print 'Males Only' and one in 2023 for 'The Blue Seat'.

Our condolences go to Andy's wife Daphne and his daughter Debra Jane by a previous marriage.

EXHIBITION SECRETARY

For the 2024 Exhibition our selectors were: Jean Brooks EFIAP/s, Glyn Edmunds ARPS APSA EPSA EFIAP/g and David Smith LRPS CPAGB BPE1*. The Best Monochrome Print award went to John McDowall of Cambridge CC for 'Tree in Mist and Frost'. The Best Colour Print award also went to John for 'Sunrise on the River Crouch'. The award for the Best Projected Digital Image went to Sophia Spurgin ARPS DPAGB of Bishop's Stortford CC for 'Fungi and Fairy Dust'.

The 2024 Exhibition statistics were: Monochrome prints: 96 members entered 315 prints of which 67 were accepted for the exhibition.

<u>Colour prints:</u> 113 members entered 406 prints of which 118 were accepted.

<u>Digital images:</u> 176 members entered 637 images of which 164 were selected.

Overall: 201 members entered work for selection; of those, 126 members had their work accepted for the exhibition.

This will be the last time we visit Wingfield Barns for our exhibition. For the 2025 Exhibition we have reserved a slot at the Apex Centre in Bury St Edmunds – more details will be sent to clubs in the autumn.

JUDGES' SECRETARY

We opened the booking system for the Judges' Workshop in February and to date have received no applications. This is a concern to myself as the Judges' Secretary but I expect more of a concern to your Club Programme Secretary. As I travel around clubs throughout the season, I am often told that we need more judges. It is not me that creates judges; it is club members that put themselves forward to become a judge that increases numbers. In the last two workshops we have appointed a higher percentage of judges from the number of delegates that have applied than previous years. I would ask all clubs to encourage anyone that feels they have the makings of a judge to come along to the workshop in November. If anyone wishes to talk to me about



The EAF Club Print Championship was on 10th March and was judged by: Peter Prosser APAGB, Sue Wilson DPAGB BPE3* and Peter Jones ARPS DPAGB BPE3*.



This year BDCC celebrates its 50th Anniversary - the present club began in 1974. One of those attending the inaugural meeting, Chris Davies ARPS DPAGB BPE2*, remains an active member. A National Lottery grant helped our conversion to digital and a successful recent application for Gift Aid has boosted club funds. Countrywide members include those from London, Scotland, the Lake District and New Zealand. Numbers have varied peaking at around 65, dropping during Covid. BDCC quickly moved online, running almost every meeting, except for print competitions. Numbers are returning towards their pre-Covid level. The club has met at various venues.

evenings from September to April. Additional groups meet separately, including, each month a photographic outing, a Zoom Critique Group, a Photo Challenge run by Ben Pike (EAF judge) and a bi-monthly Studio Group. In addition there is an annual Photo Walkabout, where members are challenged to obtain an image for each of six revealed topics. 2024 sees Chairman of the past six years, Brian Hunt, hand over to lan Gostelow ARPS DPAGB BPE4*. 2023-24 was very successful with excellent and well-known speakers including Kevin Pigney, Roy Essery, Andy Sands, Mark Gilligan and Chris Palmer as well as the David Tyler Memorial Wildlife Lecture by Bob Brind Surch and the John Clark Humorous Image Knockout Competition, in honour of two of our late members.

Although fiercely competitive, the

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emphasis has always been on retaining the friendly and encouraging character of the club and prospective members, visitors and even photographic judges are warmly welcomed and as a bonus there is a bar! Most competitions include sections for PDIs and prints including panel competitions and those with set subjects. All entries and results are managed online.

Members also get regular acceptances and awards in exhibitions run by FIAP, BPE and EAF where, this year there were six acceptances including a Highly Commended for 'Scramble'. The club encourages members to take photographic awards for RPS and PAGB and twelve members currently hold such qualifications.

Results for interclub competitions, managed by Mark Glenister CPAGB BPE3*, continue to improve, with a third place in the Cambridge Digital competition and first places in the Central Club Challenge and the annual Ampthill/Bedford/Biggleswade Battle. During the past 50 years the club has been successful in many interclub competitions making it to the Warwick PAGB Championship on several occasions. In 1996 the club was featured in Amateur Photographer magazine with an image by Pat Phillips on the front cover.

The club has three honorary members: past Programme and Competition Secretaries and Chairmen, Chris Davies and Dave Smith; and previous Secretary Pat Phillips MBE who



ST IVES INTERPRINT

On 24th February 2024, St Ives Photographic Club held the 42nd consecutive running of their well respected annual Interprint Competition.

The event this year attracted 23 clubs, members of the EAF and neighbouring Federations, who each entered six prints on an open theme. This is an increase over last year's entry and shows a positive trend as clubs resume print competitions after the pause caused by the Covid pandemic.

The prints were judged by Erica Oram CPAGB AFIAP BPE3*, a PAGB judge and a member of Sheffield Photographic Society, Gamma Photoforum

and the London Salon.

Interprint is not only a competition, but also an all-day exhibition of the high-quality photographic prints, showcasing the talents and skills of the participating clubs. The prints were displayed in the St Ives Free Church for the general public to view and enjoy, as well as members of visiting clubs, prior to the judge's comments in the evening.

The judge's comments session was attended by representatives of the participating clubs; Erica Oram provided a critique on each print, giving scores out of 20. A half-time refreshment break gave everyone a chance to catch-up and discuss the images prior to discovering the final scores.
